IV. OLD BUSINESS

Approval of Minutes – June 1st, 2026 —Minutes were reviewed and approved by the committee.

V. NEW BUSINESS

Amendment to Milton Jones Road Intergovernmental Service Agreement- Nearly \$500,000 remained because the Milton Jones Road extension contract was awarded below the available funding.

The amendment would use the remaining funds to resurface Milton Jones Road from State Highway 181 to County Road 13 and Jonesboro Road from Pollard Road to Friendship Road. Baldwin County had approved the amendment, and the work was being scheduled with the goal of completing as much as possible before school began.

Low base bid: \$464,635.77 from Youngblood-Barrett Construction & Engineering, LLC.
Estimated total project cost: \$527,467.56.
Requested General Fund appropriation: \$328,003 after applying proceeds from the former property sale.

Surplus 2025 Street Sweeper- The sweeper had recurring mechanical failures, extended downtime, and substantial repair costs.
After reviewing comparable auction values, staff recommended accepting an \$80,000 offer from Sinclair Equipment & Finance, LLC.

MOTION by Councilman Hughes to recommend to Council to authorize the Mayor to sell the street sweeper to Sinclair Equipment & Finance, LLC for \$80,000.
Seconded by Councilwoman Messinger.

VI. City Engineer's Report (Separate Handout)

Andy presented the City Engineer's Report and advised that the Committee members had received a copy of the report in their packet.

Bayfront: Surcharge work was complete; site preparation and utility work were underway.

Justice Center: Approximately 96% complete, with millwork remaining.

Bridge project: Structure sizing, hydraulic analysis, environmental documentation, and 60% plans were progressing.

Milton Jones Road Extension: County Road 13 was expected to reopen by the last week of July, with the extension targeted for the same period.

Lancaster Ditch: Bids were opened. Hydraulic analysis confirmed the existing Main Street culvert could remain, reducing the project cost; downstream drainage work will proceed.

Lake Forest drainage: Work in the powerline easement was scheduled to begin July 14.

Highway 181 lighting: Approximately 20 additional lights were planned. A possible northern extension would require coordination with Baldwin County and ALDOT.

Mosquito response: Public Works coordinated citizen calls, contractor operations, and additional outside resources during unusually heavy mosquito activity.

Street Maintenance presentation: Manager Brandon Fulton presented photographs of citywide sidewalk, asphalt, drainage, ADA, shoulder, concrete, and speed-table projects.

Work highlights: Civic Center, Fire Station No. 4, Lakefront Drive, County Road 13, General's Park, Historic Malbis, Whispering Pines Road, Potters Mill, and Wexford Lane.

Staff recognition: The Committee recognized the division for expanding its in-house capabilities, improving efficiency, and reducing outsourced work.

Windsor Drive drainage easement: The City keeps the drainage path open for water flow but does not maintain private property for appearance. Other maintenance remains the responsibility of the property owner or homeowners association.

Debris and fencing concerns: The matter was to be forwarded for review of possible code issues.

Speed table: Staff was asked to review the condition and striping of a speed table near Carolina Avenue.

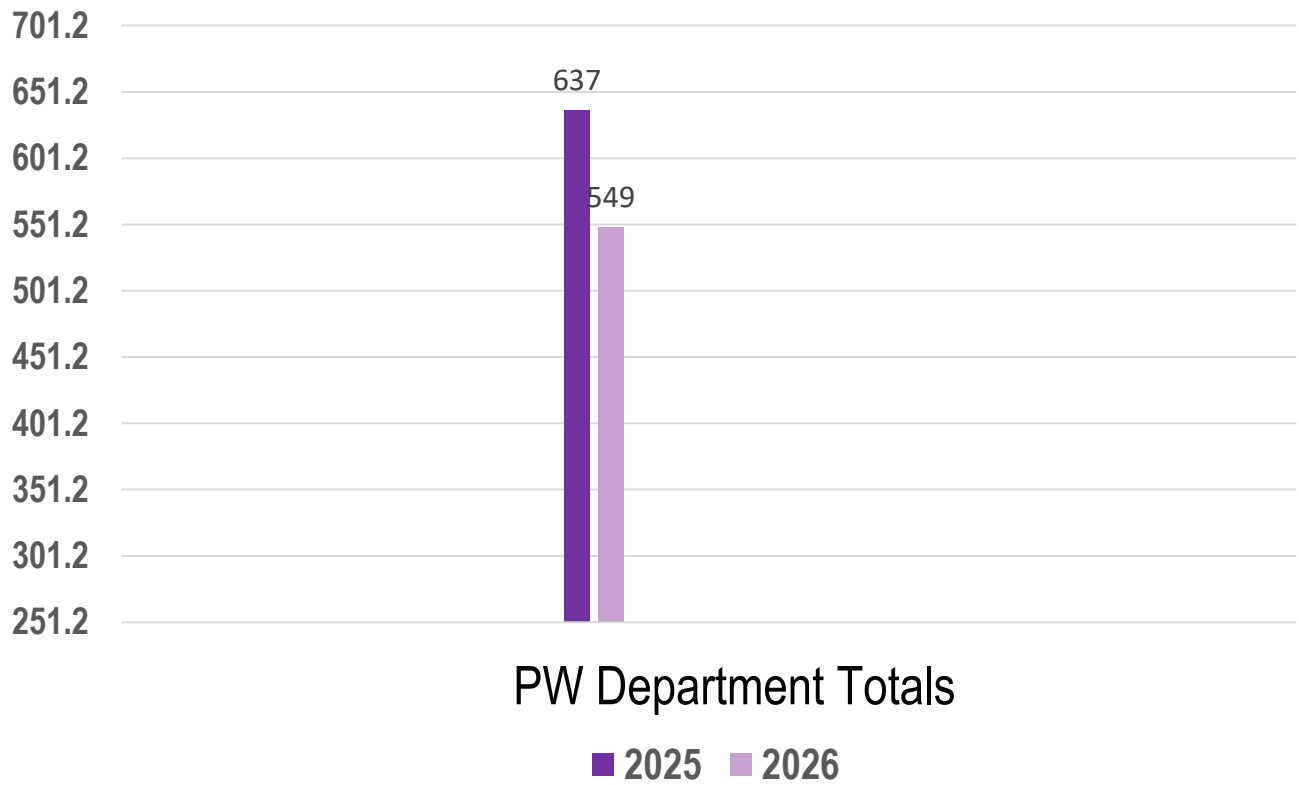

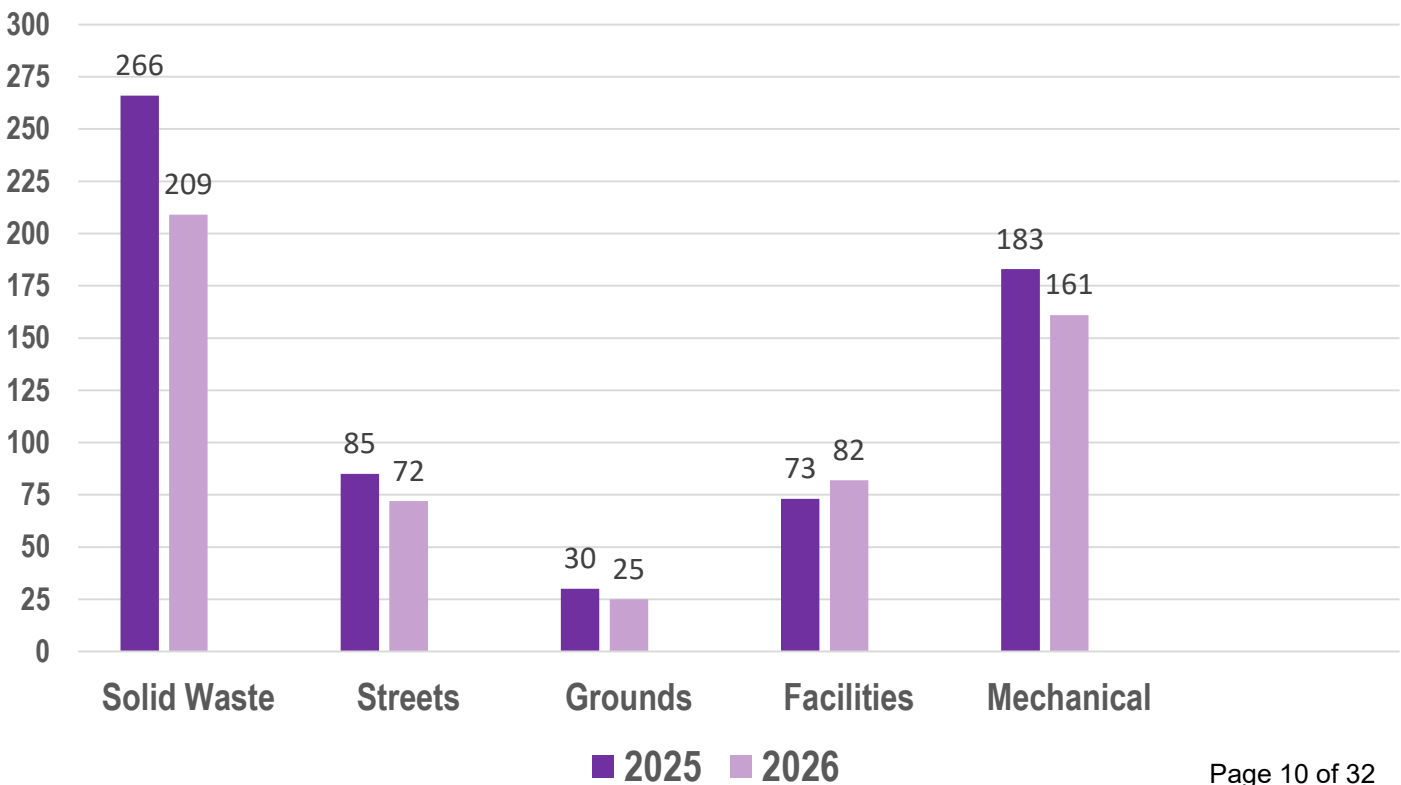

Monthly Report for June 2026

In June, temperatures remained warm across the City of Daphne, with daytime highs frequently reaching the mid-80s and nighttime lows in the upper 60s. Rainfall totaled around 4 to 7 inches across trap sites, slightly above May's totals. Mosquito activity increased sharply, with New Jersey light-trap collections rising to 57, up from 29 in May. The majority of mosquitoes collected were *Anopheles crucians*, a late-night feeding swamp mosquito. Other species included *Aedes vexans*, an aggressive-biting floodwater mosquito, and *Aedes sollicitans*, a salt-marsh species that surged following a large hatch-off event early in the month. This hatch contributed to a significant increase in citizen service requests, which totaled 148 for June. No arbovirus activity was reported within the City.

We conducted 44 truck ULV applications, covering 16,538 acres. Gravid trap collections remained moderate, collecting 188 *Culex quinxs*, compared to May when we collected 178. Larviciding efforts expanded significantly, with 580,000 square feet treated using biolarvicide across all zones, focusing on roadside ditches, flooded areas, and habitats favored by *Culex* species.

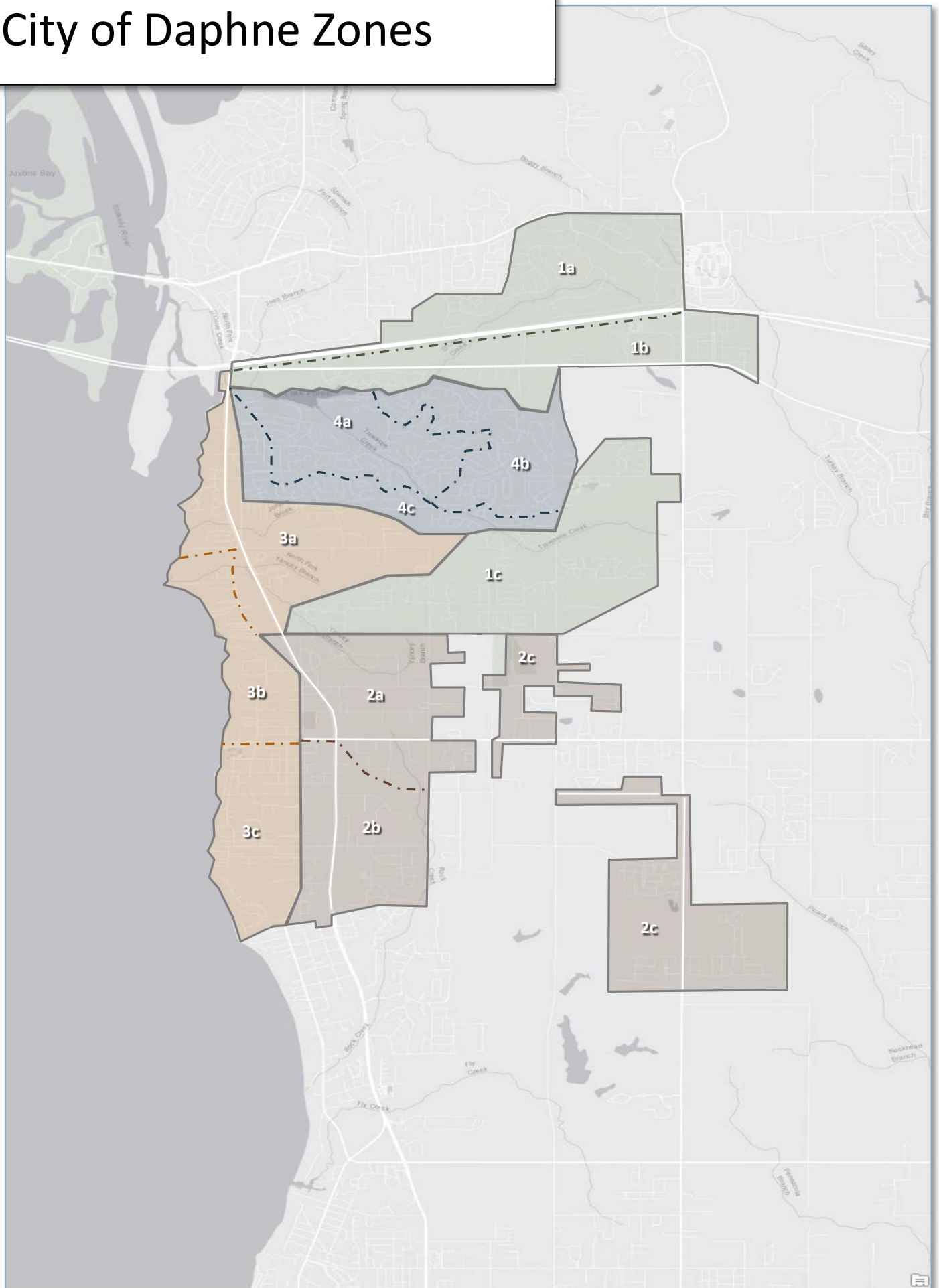
Our team maintained full operational mode throughout June. Truck ULV missions will continue to target areas of concern, and larviciding will remain focused on flooded zones and container-breeding habitats. We will maintain proactive surveillance and respond promptly to any service requests as the season progresses.

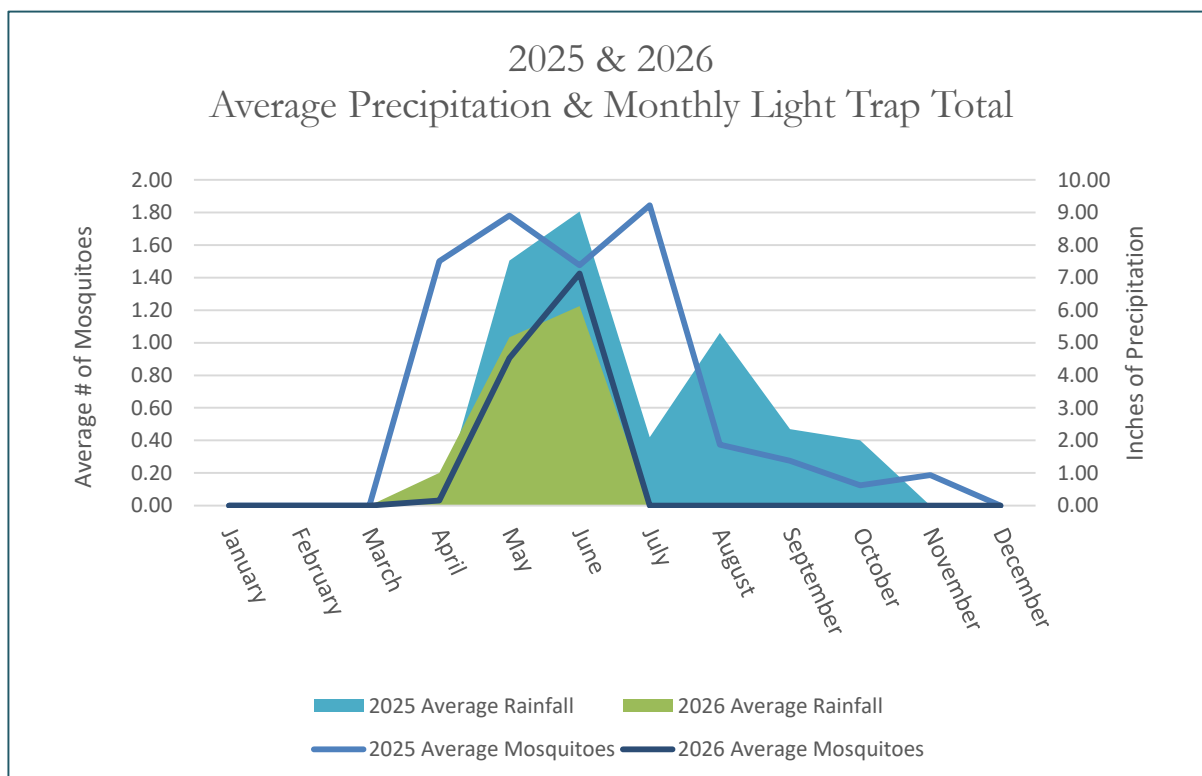
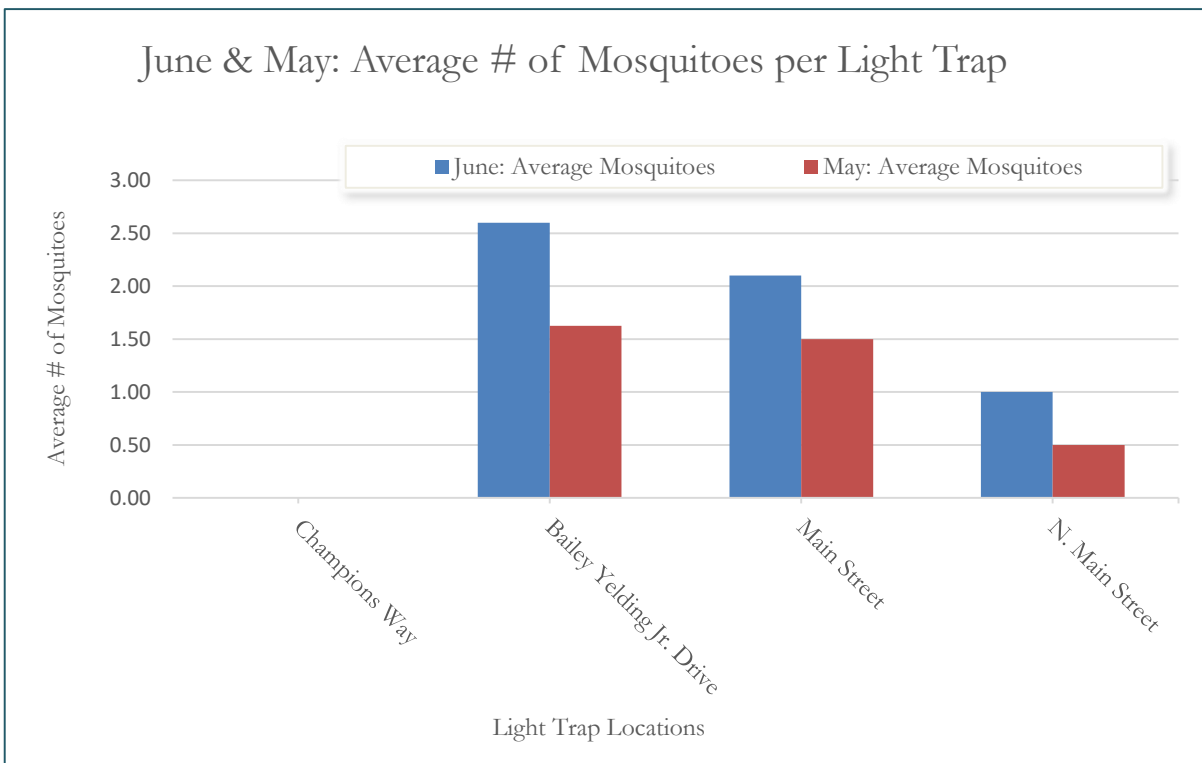

 - Members discussed recent vandalism at the trail, including damage to signage. Staff reported repairs are planned. Additional discussion included remaining trail signage, directional signs, and exotic species markers. Bobby Purvis agreed to assist with installation of remaining signs as scheduling allows.
- c. Daphne Utilities Program Updates
 - No update was received from Daphne Utilities. The committee discussed inviting utility representatives to provide updates on suggested topics. Cathy Barnette will follow up with an invitation.
- d. Engineering Project Updates
 - Members requested that staff review the suggested Good Neighbor policies and consider potential updates to stormwater planning processes to identify opportunities for continued improvement as the City continues to grow and evolve.
 - Jesi Ward provided an update on efforts to secure funding for a citywide stormwater inventory, mapping, and assessment project. The project would improve stormwater infrastructure management and planning.
- e. Bee City USA
 - Staff reported that proposed Bee City USA sign locations have been submitted for review and approval. Updates will be provided as they become available.
- f. Social media postings
 - A social media post recognizing National Pollinator Week was submitted. Members were encouraged to provide future environmental topics for City social media outreach.
- g. Old-Growth Forest Network Update
 - Staff reported that requested information has been submitted to the Old-Growth Forest Network. Recognition efforts for Village Point Park Preserve continue, with a potential recognition event anticipated this fall.

h. EAC website update

- Members discussed the recently launched City website and identified opportunities for improvement related to environmental content, navigation, and public information. A website review subcommittee was established to include: Curt Fonger, Cathy Barnette, Lee Yokel, and Steve McArthur.

V. Long Lead Time Items Requiring Consideration

- Resiliency-related topics were discussed as part of ongoing stormwater and land-use planning efforts.

- The committee discussed a request from the Planning Commission to review portions of the City's land development regulations, including wetland and buffer requirements. - Staff also announced plans for a joint Environmental Advisory Committee meeting with neighboring (Baldwin County and Fairhope) EAC Committees scheduled for September 22, 2026.
- A motion was made by Victoria Phelps and seconded to reschedule the September EAC meeting from September 21, 2026, to September 28, 2026, to accommodate participation in the joint meeting. Motion passed.
